

## **Ansbach District Is Big, Bold, Beautifully Franconian**

Politically, the Ansbach District does not include the actual urban district of [Ansbach](#), but it still has the largest surface area of any district in [Bavaria](#).

If you pay a visit to the northern half of the district, you may be surprised to find most of its gently hilled countryside is virtually unspoiled. This is the Nature Park [Frankenhöhe](#), 1,100 square kilometers of unadulterated, sun-rich natural environs.
