The ornate Rosenau Castle in [Rödental](#) is something of a museum unto itself, with 36 acres of gardens and hundreds of 19th-century artifacts on display. And in Untersiemau, you can take a stroll along the Planets Way, an educational walking path detailing aspects of our solar system.

Looking for more activities? In [Neustadt bei Coburg](#) hardly a week goes by without special cultural events. These include a colorful Children's Fest each summer, a regular two-day Swing-in-the-Park music extravaganza, a much-anticipated annual Puppet Festival, and more.
