

Donnersbergkreis Surrounds The Highest Mountain In The State

Sitting in central [Rhineland-Palatinate](#) is the mountainous Donnersbergkreis. Surrounding the highest peak in the state (687 m / 2254 ft), this region is in the north of the [Pfälzer Wald](#) — the very large forested territory covering most of the southern part of this state.
