1. Experiencing The Revitalized Landschaftspark Nord

Zoo Duisburg offered Europe its first dolphinarium in 1965. In addition to the 1814 animals of 323 species, like giraffes, elephants and koalas, you can also take a visit the lovely Chinese garden housed within the zoo.
