Russian Bears in Eitorf? Sounds pretty strange until you find out that the Russian Bear is a type of butterfly that you might find at the old stone quarry.

This area isn't in operation anymore, but is a refuge for plants and animals. Those interested in geology will find this site, which is now a tourist attraction, a good choice.

Are you brave? You don't have to be really brave to cross the Halft suspension bridge. This is a foot bridge that goes over the Sieg River. You might be a bit more reluctant to cross it once you find out that the bridge was built during the [Second World War](#) by ordinary citizens as a way to get across the river.

Traveling with children (who can speak German) to Eitorf means that you might enjoy a trip to the

nature trail *Waldimkerei*. This path educates walkers about protecting the forest, what is so special about this particular forest and what animals you can see in the area.

Those not traveling with kiddies might find a trip to the Leuscheid a better option. This is a forested area that is now a protected area.
