

## Hainburg Is A Small Town And Proud Of It

Hainburg is a compact little town that pretty much takes for granted its natural beauty and pastoral lifestyle. By no means can it be labeled a big city, but it does not lack for comforts if that's what's preying on your mind.

There it lies on the banks of the [Main](#) and gets on with the matter of living in its own placid little world. By the way, in 1977 it was merged with the neighboring Klein-Krotzenburg considerably enlarging its borders.

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Hainburg is where you'll find the preserved remains of an old Roman settlement. That should tell you plenty of its antiquity. In fact, the little town has had quite a turbulent past mainly due to infighting among overlords and the [Thirty Years' War](#).

These days it's just another small town well connected to big cities like [Frankfurt](#) and [Seligenstadt](#).

Hainburg's prime specimen of medieval architecture would be the old Catholic Church of St. Nikolaus and the elegant Liebfrauen Chapel. The *Liebfrauenheide* deep in the Hainburg woods is also worth exploring.

The little grotto of Holy Mary of the Simeon-Stift is another delightful venue. There's also the local library and the community center which gives you a good idea of what's going on at the moment.
