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Situated on the Ilmenau River, [Lüneburg](#) is one of the most populated district seats in [Lower Saxony](#) and a member of the [Hanseatic League](#). It also has the most bars per capita in the country, so finding a drink here should never be a problem.

Some must-see sights in the ten-centuries-old capital are the spectacular city hall, the teeming

shopping streets downtown, and the German Salt Museum, which documents Lüneburg's past as a saline center. It is now better known as university town and salt as the main ingredient in its wellness spas.

Somewhat overshadowed, [Bleckede](#) offers its own mix of arts, culture and nature on the banks of the Elbe River. Pay a visit to the town's modern "old" castle, the Elbschloss, which hosts exhibitions, cultural events, festivals and a medieval market each summer, as well as regional crafts workshops throughout the year.

Two others stops worth your time are the free towns of [Adendorf](#) and [Amt Neuhaus](#). The former is great for outdoor fun and excellent restaurants serving a variety of world cuisines. The latter is the nation's only former East German territory to become part of an original West German district. Look for the trademark white storks here, nesting on the rooftops.
