It takes you back in time as you curve your way towards [Koblenz](#) watching the fairy tale castles pass by.

The capital [Ingelheim am Rhein](#), is famous for its fruit growing — with huge crops of apples and strawberries, along with regular cherry and plum markets throughout the season. But the whole riverside is saved for vineyards — some being almost vertical up the steep gorges — as well as many extending into the [Hunsrück](#) mountains.
