The Town Hall is another imposing structure that you shouldn't miss. The Castle of the Teutonic Knights or the *Deutschordensschloss* will impress you with its antique stateliness. It is, however, today the Two Wheeler Museum.

Speaking of two wheelers, it might interest you to know that Neckarsulm is the home of the Audi automobiles. It's quite fascinating to know that the town has this affinity for wheels that go back to the 19th century; and the production of bicycles, which then graduated to motorbikes and eventually to automobiles. Well, Neckarsulm is more than a biker's paradise; there's also fun and excitement in other forms such as the kind you'll find at the Aquatoll, a popular swimming destination.
