Many of the main towns are in one place towards the cities of [Frankfurt am Main](#) and [Offenbach am Main](#) on the northern edge. The smaller towns and villages are then strewn across the district amongst streams and woodland.

The town of [Seligenstadt](#) is thought to be one of the oldest in Germany, and has an amazingly ornate basilica within its center.

The area around [Rodgau](#) has some of the driest and mildest of climates. Locals are often found sitting outside playing chess or boules in town squares — a great place to relax.

And do visit [Neu-Isenburg](#) for the complete opposite. This town is on the flightpath for the 2nd largest airport after Heathrow — the [Frankfurt International Airport \[FRA\]](#). It is filled with hotels, roads and a huge regional shopping center.
