[Bad Urach](#) is a well-known spa town thanks to the mineral springs which rise here at an astonishing temperature of 61°C (142°F)!

The town also offers a late-medieval marketplace. Urach castle located nearby boasts one of the most attractive Renaissance rooms in the world in the form of the Golden Hall and shouldn't be missed. What is more, history is regularly brought to life as staff and volunteers dress up in medieval costumes and re-enact life as it would have been in medieval times. Cool... :-)

There is plenty more to see in the Reutlingen district though. For example, [Pfullingen](#) is home to the astonishing Schönberg Tower which is essentially two enormous towers that meet at the top under the pointed green roof.

Lastly, [Metzingen](#) draws attention to the district's wine-making traditions by housing seven original kelters — or wine presses — in open-sided buildings for your perusal. But Metzingen is also popular for having a bunch of outlet stores such as that of **Hugo Boss**, attracting hundreds of thousands of visitors every year from all over Europe (including me!).
