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The district seat is called [Pfarrkirchen](#), well known for its hundred-year history of harness racing, Bavaria's oldest. Witness the beautiful bronze statue of a black stallion standing in the town square. Also, take a moment to visit the 17th-century baroque Gartlberg Church. Overlooking the town, it attracts pilgrims from far and wide.

To the west is [Eggenfelden](#), noted for its theater, golf and sprawling street market. Take time to observe the tower of the parish church of St. Nicholas, a fine example of late Gothic architecture.

Further west is the market town of [Gangkofen](#), offering unfiltered beer served within its monastery walls. Hiking and biking trails, spacious sports facilities, tennis courts and a large heated outdoor pool round out the activities that are available to you here.

To the south on the Inn River and the Austrian border is [Simbach am Inn](#), with its biennial *Pfingstdult* festival, annual town festival in June, angling celebration in September and nine-day Advent Procession each winter. You will also find geothermal power is generated here, too. :-)
