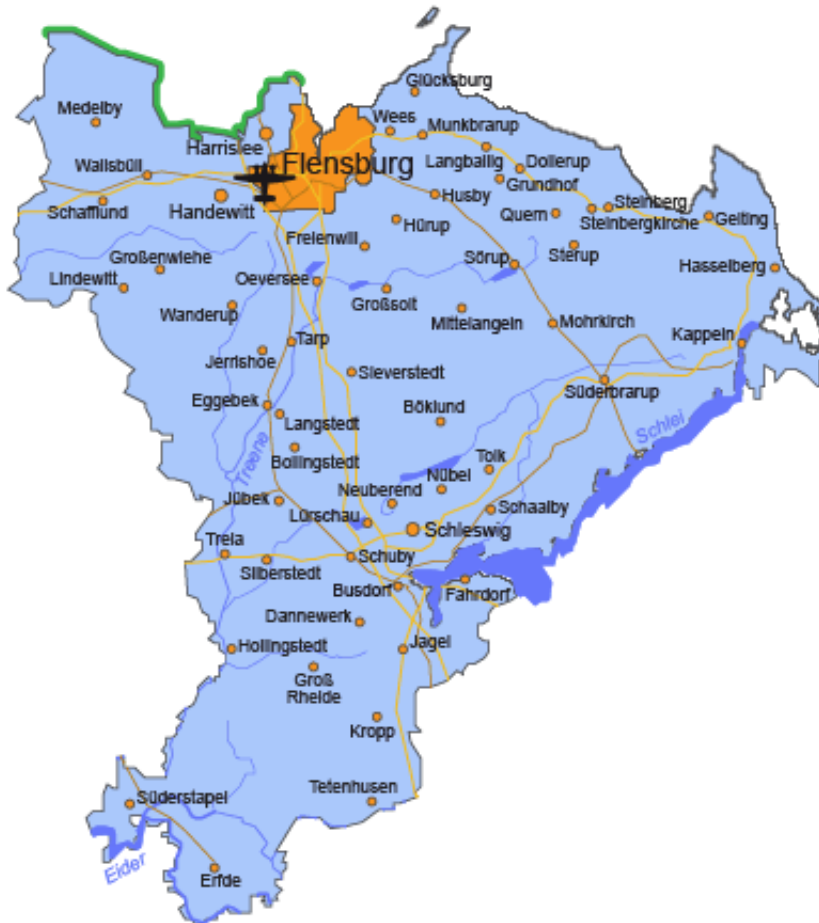


Schleswig-Flensburg District Is An Ancient Land

Bordering Denmark to the north, and running along the coast of the [Baltic Sea](#) is the Schleswig-Flensburg District. The southern border is defined by the extensive Schlei — a huge salt-water inlet carved over 40km (25mi) into the mainland.

The capital town of [Schleswig](#) is at the end of the inlet and its great cathedral houses the tomb of King Frederick I of Denmark. Just outside of town is the village of Hedeby — an ancient Viking settlement that can still be visited today.

Many of the region's main towns are very close to Denmark, and the town of [Glücksburg](#) on the Baltic coast houses a royal moated castle. The three-winged Renaissance Water Castle (*Wasserschloss*) is perfectly formed and appears to float on the surrounding lake. Many royal families have resided here, including those from Russia and Greece.

The Schleswig-Flensburg District is also the home of the “Anglen” — the ancient Germanic tribe that colonised England and gave the land its name.
