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At the northern tip of Lake Starnberg is the district seat, also named [Starnberg](#). Walking the lake's promenade, sailing its clear waters, or visiting nearby *Starnberger Schloss* (castle) with its well-kept gardens are just a few activities you won't want to miss here.

On the western side of the lake, [Pöcking](#), Feldafing and [Tutzing](#) are known as retreats for celebrities, including Otto von Habsburg, the Crown Prince of Austria-Hungary. Lakeside dining and sightseeing cruises are readily available here.

The towns of [Weßling](#) and [Wörthsee](#) reside beside smaller lakes from which they take their names, respectively. [Seefeld](#) is located by the Pilsensee and features an impressive 14th-century castle.

On the eastern shore of the Amersee, you can visit a mini-castle or catch a steamship for a tour of the lake from the town known as Herrsching. Its five-kilometer promenade is the country's longest.

At the northern end you will find Inning am Ammersee, a town with easy access to all five lakes. It also offers a wide array of outdoor activities, from fishing and sailing to hiking, bowling, miniature golf, horseback riding and tennis.

Oh, and don't forget [Gauting](#) which is considered to be one of Charlemagne's possible birthplaces.
