In the town of [Uelzen](#), which is the district seat, you will want to see *Hundertwasser Bahnhof*, time and time again ranked as one of the three most impressive train stations in Germany. The Oldenstadt monastery and 18th-century Castle Holdenstedt are also located here and well worth a visit.

To the north, [Bienenbüttel](#) is on the high-speed rail route connecting [Hamburg](#) and [Hanover](#). Here you can spend time lazing by the pool at the forest-surrounded Waldbad outdoor swimming complex. A diving tower, beach volleyball courts, a water slide and other facilities are also available for your recreational pleasure.

Along the Ilmenau River to the north, you will come to [Bad Bevensen](#), a spa town noted for its

thermal iodine waters, first-class hotels and cozy restaurants with nourishing home-style cooking.

Meanwhile in the south along the Aue River, Bad Bodenteich offers, in addition to its health spas, a 17th-century castle, Burg Bodenteich, which has been turned into an informative local museum.
