The Verden District is traversed by the [Weser](#), [Aller](#) and Wümme rivers. It includes portions of the [Lüneburg Heath](#) and the suburbs of [Bremen](#). There is not much missing here for any kind of holiday you prefer.

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Just east of Bremen, [Achim](#) features the Weser River Valley, the Badener Mountains and the high sand dunes of the heath, making it the perfect location for your outdoor excursions. For camping nearby, stop at [Oyten](#), where you will find campgrounds by the sandy shores of its kilometer-long lake.

Head northeast to [Ottersberg](#) if you enjoy cycling. Signposted cycle paths will take you along the Green Ring around Bremen, the Wümme Path along the river, or a long distance challenge all the way to Hamburg.

The town of [Verden](#) is the district capital on the Aller River. Noteworthy here are its churches: the 12th-century St. John's Church with its baroque tower, the 13th-century St. Andrew's Church, and a cathedral established in 1490.

Surrounding the capital are three interesting towns. Visit [Kirchlinteln](#) for its Lindhoop Monument made of local boulders. Go to [Dörverden](#) to see its landmark windmill, reconstructed in 1857 on the site of a 12th-century original.

And don't miss [Langwedel](#), where 19th-century Castle Etelsen has been recast as a training and conference facility.
