Surrounded by fields and meadows filled with small woods and local wildlife, it is also home to the Erlfeld — a well known regional horse-racing track which holds a very popular annual Derby.

[Warendorf](#), the district capital, has a well preserved medieval center to while away a few hours sight-seeing and a few more to relax in the pedestrian zones and numerous restaurants along the narrow streets and plazas.
