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The district politically excludes the capital town, [Würzburg](#), at its center, and radiates out through the countryside to include fifteen distinct market towns.

Among them are [Höchberg](#), with its noteworthy, nearby Marienberg Fortress and locally brewed beer, and [Rimpar](#), where the Grumbach vom Kobersberg Castle is located.

Southeast of the capital, Eibelstadt is a small, walled wine-producing town on the Main River, worthy of a stop for domestic tastings. Further south along the Main, [Ochsenfurt](#) is a major beer and wine town you will not want to miss. And deeper south, on the Mülbach and Gollach rivers, the medieval town of Aub has many old churches, buildings and ruins for you to explore.

Röttingen on the Tauber River is where you will find some of the richest soil for vines in [Franconia](#). The varietals grown here include Riesling, Müller-Thurgau, and Silvaner, among others, plus a grape unique to the area, Tauberschwarz. Production is so small, you will not find wine from this local grape exported, so be sure to try it when you're here! ;-)
